





rules are clear <<u>https://www.d.umn.edu/cla/faculty/troufs/anth1095/gcgrades.html#strikezone</u>> as are the stated criteria for written projects and exams

But, in the end, they are both human judgments.

The biggest difference between a Major League Umpire calling balls and strikes and a professor calling a grade is that you jet ejected from the baseball game if you are argue balls and strikes (see Section 9.02 Official Baseball Rules <<u>http://mlb.mlb.com/mlb/official info/official rules/foreword.jsp</u>> and One *should* really question the prof if they didn't like the call, and that is especially true for midterm exams as one can often learn quite a bit that is helpful for the Final Exam by looking over and discussing a midterm exam.
