



Some tips on dealing efficiently with

Wrestling Canvas "Modules"

One of the main complaints regarding Canvas is that it can be difficult to find and keep track of assignments.


Right now, before you do anything else, try this to help fix that problem . . .

First access Your Canvas Modules from your "Home Page" . . .



That will take you to your Canvas "Modules" file and that will look something like the screenshot below. Notice (in the screenshot below) that in the upper right-hand corner there is a button that usually says "Collapse All": Collapse All":

(The first two weeks there is always a lot of information. After that, it's not so bad.)



REM: Links on screenshots are not "hot" (active)

If you like a really clean-looking de-cluttered page that is also efficient to work with, click on the "Collapse All" button in the upper right-hand corner of your Modules folder to de-clutter your screen. That will make your life *much* easier.

VOILA!


The de-cluttered collapsed version of your Modules will look something like the screenshot below, and the button will have changed to "Expand All" . . . Expand All

Your Modules folder will look something like the screenshot below and what is shown on that screen contains more than a month's worth of information).

It's generally a good idea to collapse your Modules when you are not using all of them.

(Sorry; Canvas does not permit instructors to set the default to open with all modules closed.)

You can always . . .




Or open just the information that you want to look at one week at a time . . :
