#### **Rural Pre-Med Summit**

If you are considering a career in rural family medicine, the Rural Pre-Med Summit at the University of Minnesota Medical School Duluth is designed to help you become a competitive applicant for medical school. Participants will hear from faculty, physicians and medical students about the challenges and rewards of pursuing a career in rural medicine.

There is no charge for the summit; however, space is limited and registration is required. Intended for premedical undergraduates between their sophomore and junior years as well as nontraditional students who plan to enter medical school in one to three years, the

program is hosted by the University of Minnesota Medical School on the Duluth campus.

This program will provide an overview of the kinds of candidates sought by



medical schools, prerequisite courses, and a review of the entire application process. Information on writing personal statements, the MCAT, interviewing for medical school, and navigating the AMCAS form will be presented. Current medical students will give their perspective on the admissions process and life in medical school. Rural family physicians will provide invaluable information about rural practice. Breakout groups will provide handson experience related to obstetrics and delivery, heart sounds, digital otoscopes, and anatomy/pathology.
