SCHOLARSHIPS

BEST OF CLASS SCHOLARSHIP	Minnesota residents who rank #1 or #2 in their high school class with a 3.9+ GPA can earn up to \$6,000 per year (up to 4 years).
UMD SCHOLARSHIP	Awarded to students based on the primary and secondary factors used in the admissions process (up to 4 years).
UMD (RAISEME) SCHOLARSHIP	3.2+ core GPA and completed RaiseMe portfolio by December 15. Scholarship award is dependent upon RaiseMe portfolio. (Up to 4 years).

ROOMMATES AND ASSIGNMENTS


